## DID YOU KNOW?

JF&CS is listed on the CRA website, and our FEPS staff are authorized to file tax returns free of charge. Many cases require months of personalized assistance due to the complexity of government programs and systems.

Nearly half of JF&CS's former foster youth Pearly nair of Jr&Cs is former loster yourn now in their twenties lack a consistent adult Project presence in their lives. Many face precarious housing, employment struggles, and unresolved trauma.

Through the Pearl Project, a JF&CS social worker connects these youth with caring adult mentors. The program supports skill-building and career planning, as well as access to:

- Housing
- Financial assistance including education funding
- Financial literacy training
- Employment resources through partners such as JVS Toronto
- Connection to the Jewish community

The Pearl Project currently supports 17 youth.
